Parents should bring proof of residency if your family is new to our school, a birth certificate and immunization record to registration.

Please have your kindergarten student **accompany you** on this day so they can participate in our **Kindergarten Screening** to guide future instruction and placement.

If you have neighbors who have students who are eligible to attend kindergarten next year, *please* tell them about this important enrollment date.

Enrolling your kindergarten student allows schools to accurately plan for the coming year.

TALK

When we use "STOP" and we "WALK away" from the problem, sometimes others will continue to behave inappropriately. When this happens, we can "TALK" to an adult.



Inclement Weather Plan

As the weather begins to cool, the expectation is for students to go outside on appropriate days. Students need to come each day dressed for **outside play**. When the temperature is below 20 degrees, students will be inside.
